Childhood and parenthood, family theater, and exploring notions of growth and gender identity are the main themes of her work. "THEY" premiered in the official selection of Cannes Film Festival 2017. She was selected as one of the 25 New Faces of Independent filmmaking in 2013 by the Filmmaker Magazine, and was in the list of 20 rising female filmmakers by IndieWire in 2017.



## Sarah Rubin

Sarah Rubin is a marketer, occasional film programmer, and doc enthusiast. Sarah is currently co-curating queer shorts for Reeling: The Chicago LGBTQ+ International Film Festival, and has previously done queer shorts programming for CIMMfest (Chicago International Movies and Music Festival). Sarah worked at Chicago Filmmakers, where she managed the organization's marketing efforts and oversaw the administration of the Chicago Digital Media Production Fund.


